**Sub: Seeking stakeholder comments on Provisionally eligible Accredited Carbon Verification Agency under Carbon Credit Trading Scheme (CCTS) – Reg.**

Dear Sir/Madam,

The Government of India has taken the initiative to develop the Indian Carbon Market (ICM) framework where a national framework has been established with an objective to reduce the greenhouse gases emissions from the Indian economy by pricing the GHG emission through trading of the carbon credit certificates. In this context, the Central Government notified the Carbon Credit Trading Scheme.

Further, the Bureau has published the Accreditation Procedure and Eligibility Criteria for Accredited Carbon Verification Agencies to define the minimum eligibility requirements for accreditation and to provide a clear and transparent procedure for accrediting eligible ACV agencies to undertake validation and/or verification activities under the ICM.

In this regard, the Bureau has received applications from agencies seeking accreditation as carbon verification agencies. As per Clause 4 of Section 7.2 (Review of Application) of the Accreditation Procedure and Eligibility Criteria for Accredited Carbon Verification Agencies, the Bureau is seeking comments and information regarding these verification agencies. Stakeholders are requested to submit their responses within 15 days from the date of this letter, i.e., by 17<sup>th</sup> January 2026, via email to [sdiddi@beeindia.gov.in](mailto:sdiddi@beeindia.gov.in).
