

Training Workshop for Financial Institutions on Energy Efficiency Financing - Dimapur

Dimapur | 17-18 December 2018



The Bureau of Energy Efficiency (BEE) in collaboration with the Nagaland State Designated Agency on Energy Conservation (NSDA) and the Indian Banks' Association (IBA) organized the "Training Workshop for Financial Institutions on Energy Efficiency Financing in India" on 17th and 18th December, 2018 at Dimapur, Nagaland. The International Finance Corporation (IFC) extended the technical support to the workshop, as part of IFC's Eco-Cities program in India, supported by the European Union (EU).





The workshop was inaugurated by Er. I.V. Chishi, Chief Electrical Inspector & Head, Nagaland State Designated Agency (NSDA) in the presence of Mr. K P Phillip, AGM, India Renewable Energy Development Agency Ltd and Mr. Chandan Roy, Frost & Sullivan. Er. Chishi spoke on the need for adopting energy efficiency (EE) measures, the huge EE investment potential which exist in the country and also detailed on the initiatives taken by BEE and NSDA for promoting EE financing.

The workshop in Dimapur was attended by 13 participants from 07 different banks represented mostly by credit officers, risk officers, and/or project appraisal officers.

The two-day training workshop provided an insight on the technical and economic characteristics of EE projects, various business models like ESCO models, technical and financial appraisal of EE projects, measurement and verification (M&V) of EE projects. The workshop included a site visit to Green Park in Dimapur, where the entire street lighting has been changed to LED lights by NSDA.

Prior to the Dimapur workshop, BEE had organized four Training of Trainers (ToT) and sixteen individual training workshops which were attended by more than 530 executives from Banks and NBFCs. BEE and IFC will conduct 4 more workshops in different cities in India over the period of next 3-4 months.
